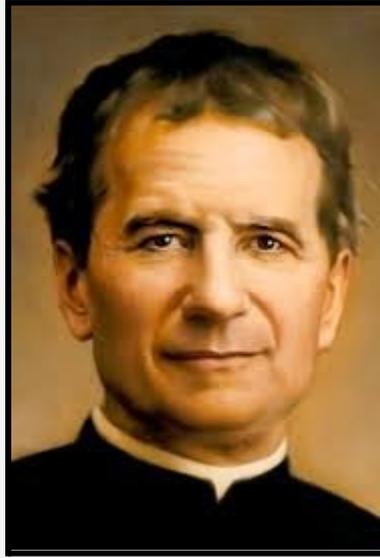

John Melchior Bosco, popularly known as Don Bosco, was an Italian Roman Catholic priest, educator, and writer of the 19th century. While working in Turin, where the population suffered many of the ill-effects of industrialization and urbanization, he dedicated his life to the betterment and education of street children, juvenile delinquents and other at-risk youth. Don Bosco developed a teaching method based on love rather than punishment, a method that became known as the Salesian Preventive System. It is based on three pillars: Reason, Religion and Loving Kindness.

Don Bosco was canonized as a Saint on April 1, 1934 and was given the title of **"Father and Teacher of Youth"**. He is the patron saint of apprentices, editors, publishers, school children, young people, magicians & juvenile delinquents.

CODE OF CONDUCT

As students of Don Bosco College, you are expected to uphold the highest standards of behaviour, ethics, and respect for others at all times. The following rules and regulations must be adhered to:

Punctuality

- Students must arrive at college and be in their respective classrooms 10 minutes before the scheduled lecture.
- Frequently arriving late will result in students not being allowed to attend classes and being marked absent.
- Habitual tardiness may result in disciplinary action.

Parking

- Students are permitted entry/exit only from the gate in front of the Shrine near the statue of Our Lady of Fatima.
- The parking facilities within the college campus are for students' bicycles and two wheelers only.
- Students failing to wear helmets will be denied parking access on campus.
- Students are not permitted to bring cars or any other four-wheeled vehicles inside the campus.
- Students must cooperate with security personnel regarding parking regulations. Disrespecting security staff will lead to immediate disciplinary action.

Attendance

- Attendance regulations will be followed as per OA-17 of the Goa University. Only students with 75% attendance or higher will be permitted to take final examinations.
- Students who skip two or more days of regular college will have to provide a written explanation of their absence. Failing to do so will result in the intimation to parents via email.

- For intercollegiate events/activities, only authorized participating students will be granted attendance for the classes held on that day. Students attending such activities on their own accord will not receive any attendance adjustment for their respective subjects.

Dress Code

- The full college uniform, including a scarf for girls and ties for boys, must be worn everyday (Monday to Friday), as well as on other days specified by the college authorities.
- Students must wear the college uniform or T-shirt with the college logo and black or blue jeans on Saturdays
- Appropriate formal footwear must be worn on uniform days. Black sandals or black rainy shoes are permitted during the monsoon season or even during the summer season.
- For odd semesters, closed black formal shoes must be worn. Coloured shoes or sandals are permitted on non-uniform days. Flip-flops and crocs are strictly not allowed.
- A clean, neat, and modest appearance must be maintained on campus at all times.
- The college dress code must be followed, including restrictions on inappropriate or offensive clothing.
- Students are not allowed to wear jackets or sweaters that conceal the official uniform.
- Students must wear their valid college ID card at all times on campus and while representing the college in activities outside the campus.

Behaviour and Conduct

- Respectful and courteous behaviour towards faculty, staff, priests, and fellow students is expected at all times.
- Posting defamatory or derogatory content on social media that violates the institution's ethos and values will result in severe disciplinary action.
- Fighting, bullying, harassment, use of profane language, or any other disruptive behaviour will result in disciplinary action.

- Smoking, consumption of alcohol, or use of illegal substances is strictly prohibited on campus.
- All complaints or grievances should be brought to the attention of the competent authorities.

Campus and Facilities

- Students must help maintain a clean environment by taking care of their classrooms, equipment, and all college facilities.
- Any damage to college property due to negligence or intentional acts will result in fines and/or disciplinary action.
- Students must follow all safety guidelines and instructions given by faculty and management.

Note: The college reserves the right to modify these rules and regulations as needed and take appropriate disciplinary actions, including suspension or expulsion, for any violations. It is the responsibility of every student to familiarize themselves with and abide by this code of conduct.

ADMISSION PROCEDURE

As part of the implementation of the *National Education Policy (NEP) 2020* in the State of Goa, all undergraduate programmes (aided and self-financed) have been brought under the administrative purview of the Directorate of Higher Education (DHE), Government of Goa, with effect from the academic year 2023–24.

GUIDELINES

- The online admission process for the academic year 2026–27 has been updated to include mandatory registration with the Directorate of Higher Education (DHE), Goa.
- All UG admissions will be conducted through the Samarth e-Gov Central Government platform, commencing from: 21st March 2026.
- Applicants are required to register only once on the Samarth e-Gov portal, even if applying for multiple programmes within the same college.
- Registration on the Samarth e-Gov platform is free of cost.
- A Help Desk is available at the College Library (3rd Floor) to assist applicants with the registration process.

ADMISSION PROCESS

1. Online Registration

Applicants must complete the online application form on the DHE, Government of Goa portal, providing all required details, including personal data, documents, and photographs.

2. Application Verification & Assessment

Upon successful verification, applicants may be required to appear for an entrance examination and/or interview (video, telephonic, or in-person), as per Government notifications.

3. Shortlisting of Candidates

Candidates will be shortlisted based on their HSSC results and interview performance. Certain programs such as BCA, BBA, BBA (T&T) & BPEd will have an entrance test. Intimation will be communicated accordingly.

4. **Document Verification**

Shortlisted candidates must undergo physical verification of documents, as per the guidelines shared by the institution.

5. **Confirmation of Admission**

Admission will be confirmed upon full payment of academic fees within the stipulated timeframe. Fee Structure as per Goa University.

- A physical verification of documents will be carried out for which guidelines will be communicated to the applicant accordingly
- Student candidacy will be confirmed upon full payment of academic fees.

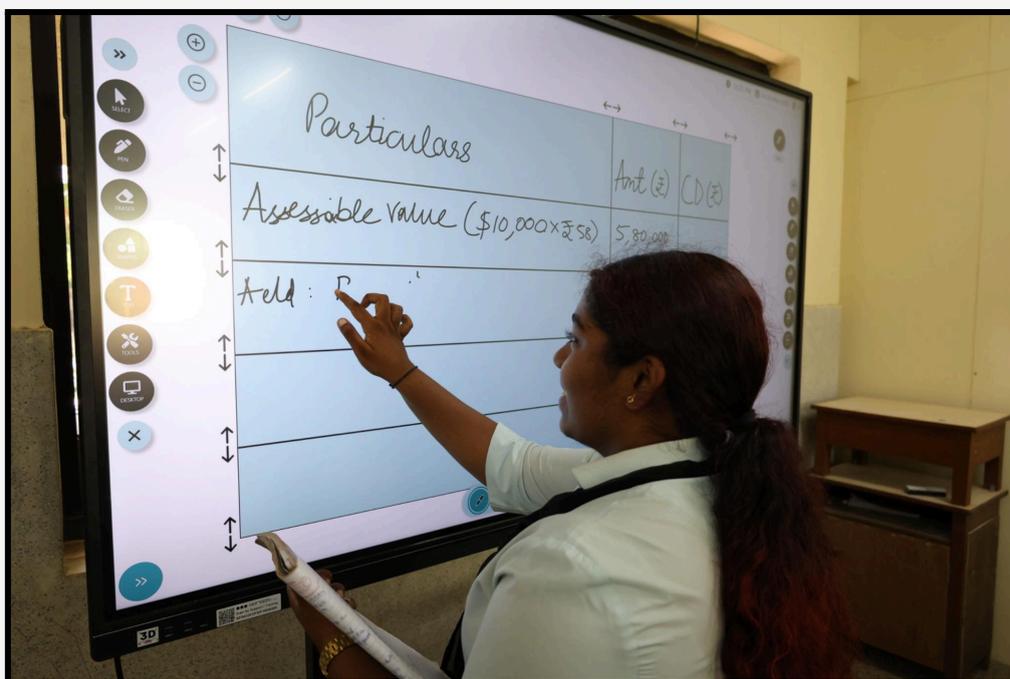

3. Document Verification

- Physical verification of original documents, including the HSSC Leaving Certificate and Eligibility Certificate (for non-Goa Board students), will be conducted.

- Applicants successfully completing their HSSC or +2 equivalent certificate recognized by Goa University with over 40% marks are eligible for the program.
- Entrance exam and/or interview with the applicant.
